Introduction

SeeGold Empire is a nomadic, cultural & tribal community based in the highlands of “Africa”. As a collective of displaced people who have been estranged from our native land, tongue, and traditions, we have found purpose and reason within creating a sovereign cultural identity to relink and express our roots. Our mission and values are rooted in spiritual salvation and natural sovereignty.

Mission

The mission of SeeGold (**Seeing Eternal Existence God Ordains Living Divinely**) Empire is *spiritual salvation and natural sovereignty*.

This spiritual salvation entails detaching from the ways of the world, specifically the cultural programming of the western world, that do not represent the true nature of native humans. To be free from the ills of the world is to return to a more balanced, ordered and naturally sovereign state of being as originally designed by the Highest i.

Vision

Our vision is to restore the sacred order of the indigenous family, create a culturally sovereign estate, and empower each person with a cultural identity rooted in the true will of the Highest i.

Goals and Objectives

- to eliminate the need to outsource and cease any reliance on major corporations and other unnatural systems;
- to reauthenticate all governmental documents and create sovereign documentation to represent the sovereign status of the SGE Estate and all of its members;
- to produce all creative & cultural works independently as a collective and utilize natural resources responsibly;
- to acquire a large parcel of land to further facilitate our natural and godly sovereignty undisturbed
- to uphold native (African) family values and practices, and to reinstall a sense of collective identity amongst displaced people;

- to cleanse the spirits of displaced people, and break the worldly illusions of time, separation, borders, and babylon labor (jobs and money).

Community Rules

We do not argue.

We do not yell or raise our voices.

We do not speak as another speaks.

We do not use sarcasm.

We do not use profane language.

We do not lie.

We do not hide or keep secrets.

We act with integrity.

We are patient.

We are humble.

We are present and intentional.

We do not prepare food while imbalanced.

We do not use electronics during meetings (unless otherwise stated).

Order of Operation

As a growing community and organization, SeeGold has an order of operation that we know is essential to maintaining our privacy, sovereignty, and organized movements. Every member of our community must operate within this order to prevent our operation and mission from being compromised.

- **We must not disclose our highcation or whereabouts.** The only moment(s) when this is agreeable and permissible is when the group has decided and agreed. Otherwise, ***never*** disclose our location, where we live, or anything of the sort. The purpose of this is simply to maintain a sense of privacy and to not be accessible. We also enforce this by turning the location services, across all devices, off.
- **We must dress in uniform.** We are in the process of designing and creating our cultural and tribal wear. As we are transitioning from the modern clothing to our tribal, more uniformed dress, we still dress as modest and covered as possible. Upon creating and designing our tribal clothing, we will have specific fits for public and private affairs. In addition to our clothing, how we keep our hair is a part of our cultural expression. ***Every tribesperson, male and female, must refrain from the maintenance (twisting, combing, brushing, braiding, separating, etc) of the hair.*** Our keys (hair, “locs”) serve as a symbol of the covenant we have with the Highest i, and is the most authentic expression of who we are.
- **We must fully wean ourselves from using the english language.** *See Sigo Bamalada.*
- **We must all know and embrace the importance of hierarchy.** *See Hierarchy, Roles and Positions.*

Hierarchy, Roles and Positions

The purpose of hierarchy, roles and positions is organization, and to be an optimally functioning body. Those in positions of authority, and those with other roles and positions, have experience, knowledge, insight and wisdom that allows them to be specialists in specific areas. This does not make any one better or worse. It is simply to be an organized and harmonious body.

Royal Seats. SGE Empire comprises different royal seats, such as Nikosi Seat and Mikael Seat. Each potential head of each seat is to be enseatd by blood, or marriage. As SGE has an egalitarian structure, there is a possibility and option for a female to be enseatd. Persons in line to be enseatd can decline the offer, as those enseatd have specific responsibilities, such as facilitating and carrying out charitable services for the community and neighboring tribes. *The royal seats of SGE are in positions of authority and thus have different statuses and ranks within*

the Empire due to specific responsibilities, though this does not diminish the value of the other families within the community.

Counsel of Elders. Our Counsel of Elders will have an egalitarian structure, with both male and female leaders. Any decisions made by the Royal Seats, whether male or female, must be approved by the Counsel of Elders.

Cultural Traditions, Customs and Rites

Holidays, Ceremonies and Gatherings

SeeGold Empire does not observe or celebrate any western, modern or American holidays, including birthdays.

We do not host or attend funerals, as we do not observe the worldly reality of death. However, in the event that a community member is notified of the transition of a family member or love one abroad, it is permitted for the community member(s) to take a day of prayer and meditation IF he/she chooses.

As a community, we observe Ethiopian Orthodox holidays as a symbol of respect. Though, we do not celebrate nor do we host or attend events and festivals.

We have our own customary festivals, which includes a harvest festival, naming ceremonies, marriage ceremonies, child birth ceremonies, purification rituals, and other rites of passages.

We observe the sabbath. We take a day of rest to gather as a community and fulfill charitable deeds within the surrounding communities and villages. The Sabbath is also a period of fasting.

Purification Rituals and Naming Ceremonies

Initiates and potential members of the community will be required to complete a series of purification rituals to cleanse and renew the mind, body and spirit from the cultural programming of the western world, while reprogramming them with the cultural trajectory, integrity, and overall essence of SeeGold Empire. These rituals and ceremonial activities will be kept private.

Sigo Bamalada

Sigo Bamalada is a Khoisan language, comprised of a variety of click consonants. This is the primary language of the community used for tribal communication and cultural identification. As

a Khoisan click language, Sigo Bamalada is an ancient way of speaking that represents the original mind of humanity.

Language is an important, if not the most important, aspect of every culture and it both shapes and represents the mind of the speaker. Sigo Bamalada is designed to assist in the disintegration of the English speaking mind, and restoration of the original native mind and spirit.

Sigo Bamalada can be spoken with and without the clicks.

Traditional Marriage and Family Cultivation

Both polygyny and monogamy are permitted and respected within the community, so long as each party is on one accord and are inified within the mission of SGE. Arranged marriage is also a part of the SGE culture. In the event of arranged marriage, it must be agreed and approved by each family as well as the Counsel of Elders.

SGE promotes and upholds male—female marriages only.

Rites of Passage

The Empire has Rites of Passage for both males and females, from puberty, marriage and guardianship (parenthood). To uphold the sacrdness of these passages, these rituals will be kept private.

Traditional Birthing

All birthing ceremonies will be held within or in nearby bush areas to our Seedling & Birthing Home. In our seedling & birthing home, there will be a designated resting space for mothers to rest before, during, and after labor. After labor, mothers will be able to rest, and fully immerse themselves in the immediate skin-to-skin bonding with their newborn(s). During this time, there will be ample support from her Empire sisters in caring for other children, food preparation, daily activities, etc.

Only designated Empire sisters and daughters are allowed at birthing ceremonies, with the presence of the father being optional and dependent on the agreement between the mother & father.

After birth, we will provide different herbal medicines, supplements, and essentials for mothers. The herbs will be sourced from our community gardens, or gathered from nearby bush areas.

Cultural Homeschooling and Education

The homeschooling curriculum of SeeGold Empire is a nature & culture based curriculum. It is a part of SeeGold culture to utilize everyday cultural activities, which all incorporate the gauging of the land, to “educate” and further enhance our children’s spiritual & practical intelligence. This also serves as a part of the reprogramming/ritualistic activities for residential family initiates who have young children and adolescents.

Nature Based Projects, Services and Initiatives

Note: Every service and experience we offer to guests and supporters is donation based. All donations are and will be reinvested into the forward growth and expansion of the Empire.

Earth’s Haven Private Nature Reserve

Earth Haven Private Nature Reserve is a private homestead and nature preservation site, whereby we fully facilitate our sovereignty and fulfill our mission. As a *private* nature reserve, this is an area where we are able to serve as true stewards over the land and native wildlife, including plants, animals, and other native tribes. As a *private* homestead, we are able to occupy the land as another native tribe undisturbed and independent of governments or other unnatural forces.

Earth’s Haven Private Nature Reserve is not open to the public.

Earth’s Haven Campsite

The *Earth’s Haven Campsite* is the first phase project to *Earth’s Haven Private Nature Reserve*.

Earth’s Haven Camp will be home to several traditional styled structures, including accommodations, an eco recording studio, community gathering space, maternity/birth home, greenhome, garden + more sacred spaces. This bush camp will be semi-private; not fully open to the public, though open to intentionally selected guests, family and supporters who seek to experience the spiritual and natural culture of SGE. *see SeeGold Tours.*

SeeGold Tours

SeeGold Tours is our spiritual and nature based tour guide initiative, through which we provide spiritual guidance on a natural journey.

SeeGold Tours provides full accommodations at our *Earth's Haven Campsite*, which is semi—private and open to only intentionally selected guests, family and supporters. In addition to full accommodations, we provide visitors with a full insperience of hiking, gathering and foraging of wild plants, ital plantfood, spiritual (herbal) baths, cultural immersion of the surrounding communities and more.

Jah Wata

Jah (Just As Heaven) Wata is an upcoming NGO focused on natural and sustainable water catchment.

The mission of Jah Wata is to break the illusion of a lack of drinkable water and to provide a myriad of storage options that are sustainable and reusable. The use of bamboo, clay, and calabash as storage options serves as a reminder to native people of the many reusable and regenerative sources of energy available to us. In addition, Jah Wata advocates for the waterways of the Earth, and encourage everyone to be mindful of the harm caused by using plastic and other unnatural pollutants.

Jah Wata provides reusable water bottles made of Bamboo, which are not for profit. The intention of Jah Wata is to share these bottles with the surrounding village communities as a reminder to use more environmentally sound options, such as bamboo, which is the fastest growing plant on Earth and grows both abundantly and invasively on these lands.
